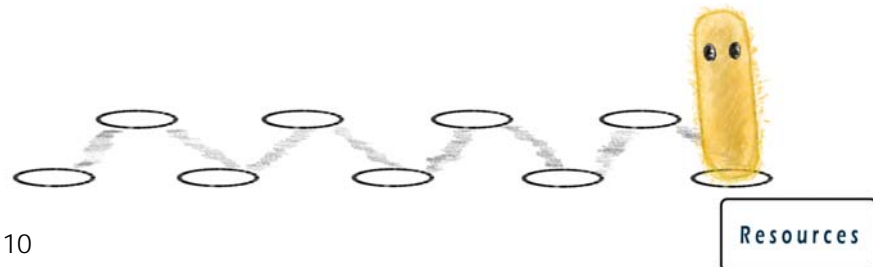

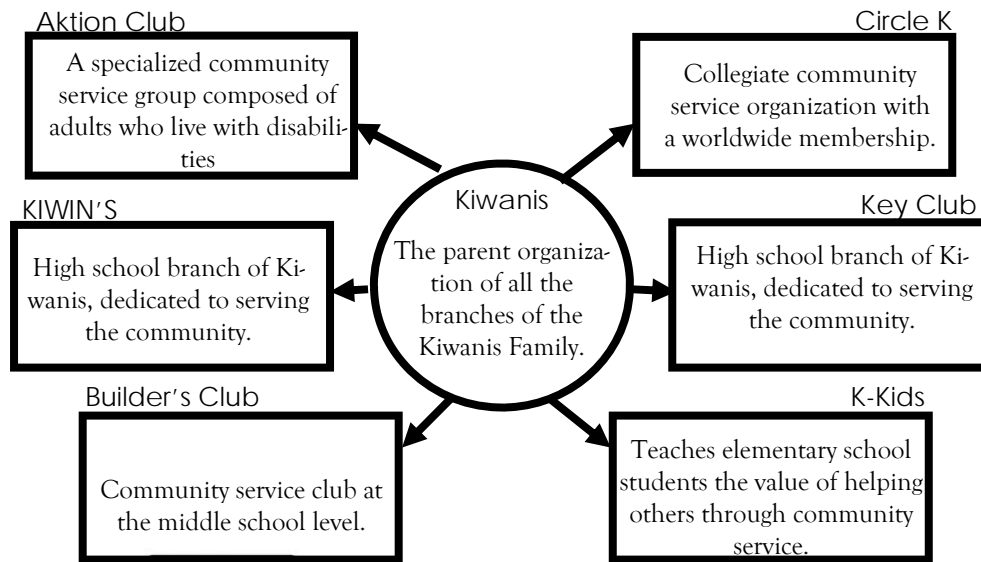

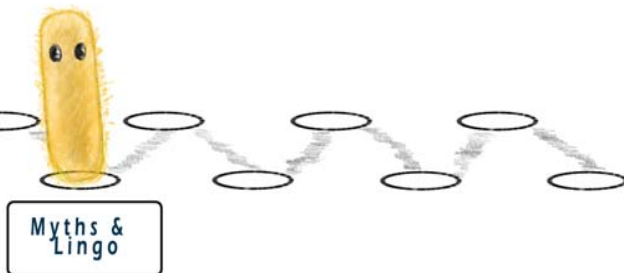
# Myths & Lingo

# Families, Spirit & Cheer

## Family System

Circle K's family system is the highlight of our club's social aspect, allowing new members to become more familiar with the club in a smaller setting. All paid members are sorted into one of seven families that are led by two or three Family Heads. Within these families, new members are paired with a "Big," someone who will act as a mentor and guide in Circle K and even your entire college experience.

Between these various families, Circle K also hosts **family competitions**, huge quarterly events where all families come together and compete to be the best. One annual family competition is the photo scavenger hunt that usually takes place at the end of Fall quarter. Each family must race around campus to take as many photos as possible from a list of clues within a certain time limit.



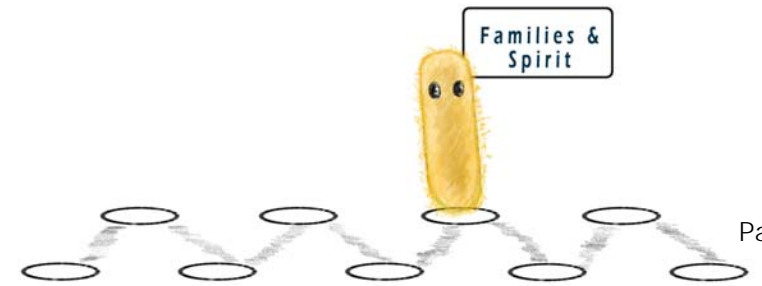

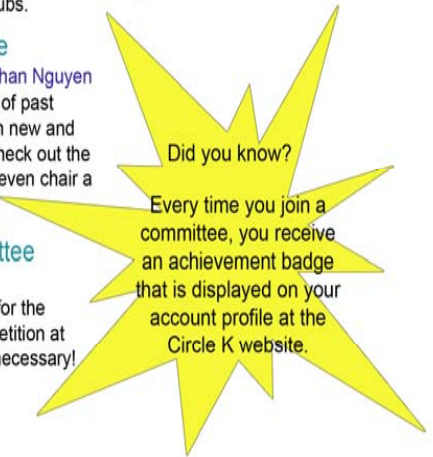
**MD&E Committee**
